

To whom it may concern,

We write with reference to the proposed CLLC 2020. We wish to submit our objection to the proposed change to level crossing XC211 (Newtown, Ballyhea).

Nora's house is situated on the Charleville side of the crossing Eircode P56 VH58- it is the third bungalow on the right in the direction of Charleville (beige bungalow with sunroom at side). She also owns the piece of land directly adjoining the level crossing on the Charleville side.

Eamonn's house is situated on the Charleville side of the crossing Eircode P56 R224 - it is the first bungalow on the right in the direction of Charleville (cream bungalow).

Our main concern with this project is we strongly object to the proposed closure of this crossing. This is one of the oldest right-of-ways in Ballyhea and is used not just by me but by a large number of people for access to school etc. It is also one of the most popular walking routes in the parish.

We feel this move will devalue our properties greatly by making this road into a cul de sac, limiting our access to one way. This would greatly impact on our homes and lifestyle. We will be seeking legal advice on this matter and will seek compensation due to the devaluation of our properties.

We trust our submissions will be taken into consideration.
