

Dear Sir/Madam,

The Trustees of the Diocese of Cloyne, holding land in trust for the parish of Ballyhea which is administered on their behalf by The Right Reverend Monsignor O'Brien, have received notice of an application to acquire by compulsory purchase lands contained in County Cork Folio no. CK25282F for the purposes of railways works under section 37 of the Transport (Railway Infrastructure) Act 2001 as amended by section 49 of the Planning and Development (Strategic Infrastructure) Act 2006. The Trustees are also registered owners on the same trust for lands in Cork County Folio no. 29035

Having taken counsel in the matter, the Trustees are to signal to An Bord Pleanala that a grant of a railway order for the purposes mentioned above would be *ultra vires*, invalid and unlawful. In consequence of which the Trustees would be obliged to refer the matter to the Courts of Justice and to seek recovery of all costs, expenditure, outlay etc.

Without prejudice to the above, the Trustees bring to the attention of ABP the entrance to the avenue along the entire northern boundary of Ballyhea National School. The entrance and avenue are dedicated facilities providing access to the school, its playground, and to the community hall for emergency vehicles (ambulance, fire tender etc.) as per planning permission granted by Cork County Council and per fire certificate issued by Chief Fire Officer for Cork County Council. They are required to be functional at all times.

The Trustees bring to the attention of ABP that emergency water supplies (fire hydrants) are required to be operational at all times.

The Trustees note the following statement made in the above mentioned application:

"It is noted that there is a planning application for a new community centre on the school grounds to the north of the school; it is not yet constructed and there is not a time frame yet available for it. Nothwithstanding, it is not expected that the proposed Project will have a significant effect on it during construction and may provide benefit through improved ease of access to it during operation" (CLL chapter 6, p. 38).

The Trustees fail to make sense of these statements, unless they are mistakenly ubicated and/or refer to another development. The Trustees clarify that the Community Hall forms part of their property, is completed and is fully operational. It has been made available full-time to the local school during the COVID emergency as supplementary space to allow the school to comply with emergency health regulations.

In the public interest an oral hearing is requested.
